Carving with Carol Russell

September 12th and 13th



It's enormously rewarding to sit and drink a cup of tea or coffee from a vessel you've carved yourself. In this 2 day class you'll design and carve a small handled cup from white beech using hand tools only.

Carving small objects is a very meditative process, the slower process of using hand tools allows you the time to really understand the relationship between the timber, the tools and the form.

- Design and function
- Choosing the right timber and cutting blanks
- Tool choice, sharpening and maintenance
- Carving techniques
- Texturing and detailing
- Food safe finishing, including painted surfaces using milk paint, chalk paint and natural pigments, shellac and waxes and Shou sugi ban (charring and brushing the surface)

Please bring with you:

- Bring your own PPE (dust mask, eye and ear protection, closed shoes)
- A notebook, paper, pencil and eraser

The course runs each day from 9am – 4pm on Saturday the 12th September and Sunday the 13th of September.
